Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT) Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. ⁶ Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take.

Outreach Ministry for January Blessing Box Ministry

A Blessing Box is a standalone miniature pantry where a person in need can come discreetly anytime of the day or night for just a bit of food, a toiletry item or maybe just a pair of socks. The Blessing Box has been in operation for almost a year now and is always open. It has made it much easier for people to have access to an emergency food source. Now when someone calls for food, we simply refer them to the Blessing Box outside of Memorial Hall.

This box has been used by many in our community, and this month we are going to collect food items to place in it. Anyone in the community can participate, and in fact we hope they do. "Take what you need, leave what you can, little becomes much in the Master's hand."

Items should be non-perishable and withstand uncontrolled temperatures. Below is a list of suggested items to help you think about what a person who is down to their last dollar could use. Please place your items on the table in the Worship Center hallway, and they will be added to the Blessing Box as needed.
